- **Brush**: Non-artist quality brushes work. Kelkar uses kids' painting brushes. Flat or round, ¼ inch flat or in diameter. A smaller brush for finer details, e.g. size 0
- Paper: 90lb or thicker
- Spray bottle
- Piece of cardboard approx 8"x10"

- Watercolor sketchbook--size per personal preference, but I recommend a minimum of 8.5 in. x 11 in.
- Fine line pen with waterproof black ink.
- Fude nib fountain pen or brush pen, waterproof black ink. If you're using a fountain pen, you'll need a bottle of waterproof ink and a fountain pen converter.
- 0.7 mechanical pencil
- Uni-ball Signo UM-153 white gel pen
- Travel watercolor set
- Traditional brushes, nos. 6 and 12 round
- Tombow Dual Brush Pens #N65 and #N95
