# Sue Spargo Material list

Journal and pencil for drawing
6" x 12" ruler, matt and rotary cutter
Freezer paper, pencil and paper scissors
#10 and 11 Straw needles for beading and cotton appliqué
#24 Chenille needle for wool appliqué
#18 Chenille needle for couching
#3 and #1 Milliners needle for wrapped stitches
60 wt. cotton thread and 50/50 wool thread for wool appliqué
Thread Heaven
Clover appliqué pins
Bohin pencil glue stick
Embroidery and fabric scissors

1" x 6" ruler

Circle template

#### Background

20" square hand dyed wool in a color of your choice for your background Small pieces of cotton fabrics in the same color as the background wool for layering of your background

#### <u>Appliqué</u>

Hand dyed wool in a variety of colors for appliqué design

Assorted small pieces of textural fabrics including hand dyed silk velvet, silk and linen. 1/4 yard Presto Sheer for stabilizing velvet

# **Embellishments**

Bring an assortment of colorful embellishment threads in different types and weights - such as - Eleganza

Perle Cottons, Chenille yarns, Seagrass, Silken Pearl, Dazzle, Razzle & #24 wt. Silk Thread and #11

Seed Beads for beading.

### Required Book

Sue's embroidery book entitled "Creative Stitching"

## Jen Kingwell Material list

- A variety of small cuts of fabric- remember to include some florals, geometrics, spots, stripes etc. in a range of colours or just your favourites. Scraps, fat
  - 1/16ths and eighths work well (and more is always better 😉)



- A fat 1/4 as a background for appliqué
- Thick template plastic
- Ultra fine permanent marker
- Scissors for cutting plastic
- Fabric scissors
- Straw or milliners needles size 11 for hand piecing
- Neutral colour 50 wt cotton thread to blend with fabrics for piecing. I use Aurifil 50wt in 2375 Antique Pink but any grey/cream etc.
- 80wt thread for appliqué in a variety of colours
- General sewing requirements e.g. pins, snips, ruler
- 0.7mm Mechanical pencil (propelling pencil) with 2B or 2 lead (USA)
- 1/4" simple seam wheel (optional but handy!)
- Sandpaper board

## For hand quilting techniques

18 inch (approx.) quilt sandwich. I.e. 2

- fat quarters and a piece of batting cut to this size. Solid fabrics work well as it's easy to visualise your stitches. Make sure the batting is recommended for hand quilting e.g. Quilters Dream Cotton Request
- Chenille needles size 24
- Perle thread 8 wt or Aurifil 12 wt
- Basting safety pins
- Hoop optional (I don't use one)
